- The more vibrant the contrast, the better. Photographs may include flora, fauna, landscapes, close-ups or panoramic views and must have been taken in Minerva or Olmstedville. People and/or animals can be included in the photo but should not be the subject of the shot.
- **Submission Deadline is Thursday, July 2nd.**
- The photos will be exhibited and judged at the Minerva Community Center on **Saturday, July 4th, 2026.**
- Winners are announced **Tuesday, July 7th.**
- There will be 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place recognition.
- The winning photographs will be placed in our frame with a brass label recognizing the photographers as the Minerva Day 2026 photo winners and hung in the Minerva Community Center as the 4th Annual Minerva Day Photography Contest winners! Your photo will be returned after a year of being displayed.
